She received her BFA from Purchase College in 2005 and MFA from Vermont College of Fine Arts in 2014.

Margaret Keller - Community Access to the Arts (CATA)

Since 2014, Margaret Keller has been Executive Director of Community Access to the Arts (CATA), a nonprofit organization that nurtures and celebrates the creativity of 650 people with disabilities across Berkshire County. Last year, CATA became the first organization in the county to receive NEPR's Art & Humanities Award. Margaret's career in nonprofits began after she completed her doctoral coursework at the University of Chicago and was lured away from the ivory tower by a passion for bringing the arts and humanities to wider audiences. As Associate Director of the Chicago Humanities Festival, Margaret led program development for a city-wide celebration of art and ideas. For her work expanding the festival's audience, she was chosen by the *Chicago Tribune* as one of the city's most influential people in the arts in 2001. She has been a grantwriter, founded an alumni magazine covering humanities research at the University of Chicago, managed foundation relations at Bard College at Simon's Rock, and served on advisory boards for the Chicago History Museum, the Center for Public Intellectuals, and the Lenox Educational Enrichment Foundation at Berkshire Taconic Community Foundation. She lives in Lenox with her husband and four children.

Diane Pearlman – Berkshire Film and Media Collaborative

Diane is an independent film producer who currently serves as the Executive Director of the Berkshire Film and Media Collaborative, a non-profit dedicated to creating education, workforce and production opportunities in the film and media industry as an economic initiative for the western Massachusetts. She is the producer of the short film, *A Tree A Rock A Cloud*, based on the story by Carson McCullers. The film was adapted and directed by award-winning actor, Karen Allen and just won Best International Short at the Manchester (England) Film Festival and will be part of the Short Film Corner at the Cannes Film Festival next month.

In the 1990's, Diane was Executive Producer and General Manager of Mass. Illusion, a visual effects movie studio located in Lenox, Massachusetts and Alameda, California. MI created effects for *The Matrix* (Academy Award 2000, Best Visual Effects), *What Dreams May Come* (Academy Award 1999, Best Visual Effects), *Starship Troopers, Evita, Eraser, Die Hard with a Vengeance, Judge Dredd*, and others.

Diane holds a degree from Vassar College and attended Princeton University and NYU Film School. She is currently Chairman of the Board of Berkshire Pulse, a performing arts center in Housatonic, MA. She is an active member of New York Women in Film and Television, The Massachusetts Production Coalition, New England Women in Film and The Visual Effects Society. Diane lives in Great Barrington, MA with her husband and two sons.
