Daniel Bosley is the owner of Dan Bosley Consulting Services whose clients include state and federal policy advocacy groups. These include the Northeast Clean Energy Council, the Massachusetts Forest Alliance, Soldier On, a homeless Veterans organization as well as the Massachusetts Workforce Professionals Association and the Museum of WWII. While in the Legislature, Bosley was appointed to the federal USTR's Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Council, as well as an intergovernmental advisory group for Homeland Security and served as the National Chair of the Council of State Governments (2003).
